The SAEC Annual Plan 2017/18 will articulate consortium participants (members and partners) and funding allocations. It will describe the actions SAEC and its members will take in 2017/18 to enhance the delivery of adult education services in the region. It will be aligned to the SAEC Regional Comprehensive (Three Year) Plan and applicable state law. All member districts are bound to the implementation of the plan and the Program Assurances. The SAEC Executive Director will facilitate development and submission of the plan with contribution from members, partners, and community stakeholders and in accordance with the SAEC Governance Plan. To date SAEC Program Committees, Leadership Committee, and subcommittees have participate in providing guidance to the SAEC Director for the 2017.18 Annual Plan. During the Board presentation, the SAEC Director will review input from these groups. By strategy, we will review key accomplishments and goals for the coming year. A full text draft will be provided at the August meeting. The 2017.18 Annual Plan is due 8.15.17.
