	Comments	<ul> <li>Does one option work better than the other? Do we look at all resources or do we look at them individually? Do we combine MOU's?</li> <li>There are advantages each way and each way is an acceptable option. If we combine we would have to add exhibits because every service provision is different for each adult school. It may be easier to write phase 2 if we are sharing resources.</li> <li>It might be easier to do MOU if we go individual. Consortium has the authority to do a single MOU without having to go to each Board.</li> </ul>	

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	Comments cont.	<ul> <li>If one adult school has a drastically different set up with WIOA the attachment is primarily the same. Matrix of services can be different. Single MOU might allow some of the smaller districts to participate. Phase 2 is a single point MOU. Potential from our strict prospective and dollar resources may provide exposure to our entire allocation. Single contract might go against how we have built ourselves. Want to keep administrative structure stream line.</li> <li>Individual Districts need to keep doing what they do. Want to think about what our current plan is and each district renegotiates. Keep individual but bigger schools work with smaller schools to use services.</li> <li>We can talk about how to access Workforce Investment opportunities through our models.</li> <li>We can change funding structures this year. Direct fund all our districts. We hold onto management structure, service, provisions, and professional provisions.</li> </ul>
